- Harvest celebrations





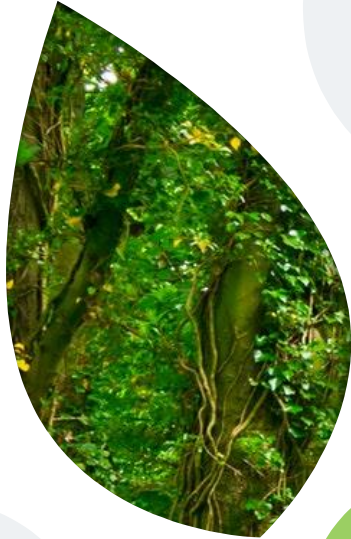

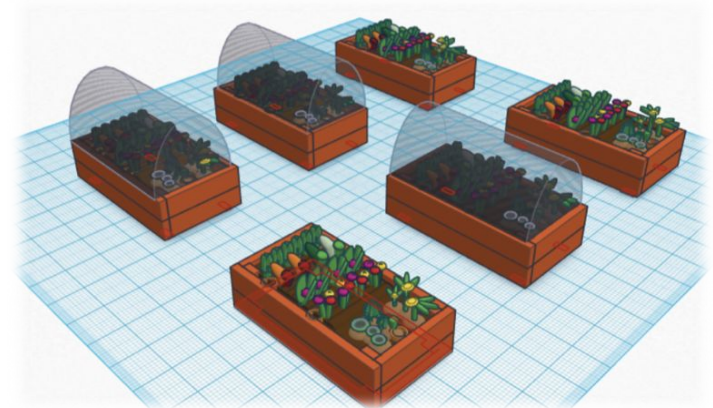
