Resident and Non-Resident Enrollment - By Category

- AB540 enrollment decreased $10 \%$ from 1,830 to 1,647 .
- Non-resident international student enrollment including all visa categories decreased 3\% from 6,401 to 6,193.

International Students

- International students with F1 or FZ visa status headcount is at 1,726, down from 1,849 last fall, a 6.6\% decrease.
- Females comprise $38 \%$ of the international students with F1 or FZ visa status.
- Top countries of origin for F1 or FZ international students includes: China, Vietnam, Taiwan, South Korea, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia and India.

Drop in FTES from Start of Term to Census
Overall, there were slightly more drops in fall 2019 than fall 2018 between the start of the term to census, an increase of 53 FTES lost.

- Face-to-face sections and hybrid sections saw no loss or gain in FTES between the start of the term and census in fall 2019.
- The percent of drops in online course sections improved from 7\% of total online enrollment to $6 \%$, suggesting fewer drops for this modality than the prior fall.

AB 705 Enrollment Shifts

- Transfer level math and English course enrollment is up $46 \%$ from last fall with an additional 38 sections and an additional 1,059 enrollments while basic skills enrollment is down $261 \%$ with 68 fewer sections and 1,959 fewer enrollments.
- Total enrollment in all EWRT courses flattened out at $0 \%$ or by only -10 enrollments
- Enrollment in EWRT1A increased 30\% by 563 enrollments and 23 additional sections
- Total enrollment in READ courses decreased 100\%
- Total enrollment in ESL courses decreased 5\% or 84 enrollments and 2 sections though AB 705 changes do not apply until fall 2020
- Total enrollment in MATH courses decreased by only $2 \%$ or 128 enrollments.
- Enrollment in MATH41, 42, or 43 decreased by $7 \%$ or 92 enrollments and 1 section
- Enrollment in MATH10, 46, 44, 11, or 17 decreased by $2 \%$ or 42 enrollments and 3 sections
- All other transfer level math enrollments are up $30 \%$ or 488 enrollments
- Total basic skills enrollment is down $2 \%$ or 128 enrollments

## Ethnicity

There was a reduction in headcount for all ethnic groups except Decline to State and Pacific Islander.

- African American headcount decreased 7\% from 761 to 705 and FTES decreased 7\%.
- Filipinx headcount decreased $4 \%$ from 1,313 to 1,257 while FTES decreased $4 \%$.
- Latinx headcount decreased $4 \%$ from 5,356 to 5,164 and FTES decreased 2\%.

Student Type

- First-time student headcount increased $4 \%$ from 3,324 to 3,460 while FTES increased $7 \%$
- Special admit high school students also increased, headcount by $8 \%$ from 530 to 570 and FTES by 7\%
- Continuing student headcount decreased $6 \%$ from 11,162 to 10,506 , however, the college awarded 144 additional awards over the prior year, which may result in fewer continuing students. See Table 13 below for details.

## Zip Code Groupings

- Headcount from Cupertino, Sunnyvale, Los Altos, Mountain View, Palo Alto, Los Gatos and Saratoga area increased $2 \%$ or 85 . This area continues to grow over the last few terms suggesting that enrollment from within our service area is growing while other areas continue to decline.
- Headcount from San Jose East of 880, Alviso, Milpitas, Fremont, Union City, Newark, Hayward and East Palo Alto decreased 6\% or 578.
- Headcount from San Jose Other, Santa Clara, Morgan Hill, Gilroy, and Campbell decreased $5 \%$ or 230 .
