			How 'One More Thing' Can Lead to 'Far <i>Fewer</i> Things':
			Assessment as a mechanism for managing workload

			Abstract:A common concern about the ongoing requirement to assesslearning outcomes on our campus pertains to stress andschedule management. The worry, in short, is that the timespent on assessment compounds a workload that, for manyfaculty and staff, already exceeds reasonable expectations.In this workshop, De Anza's SLO Coordinators will use examplesto illustrate the possibility that an investment in authenticoutcomes assessment work can in fact serve to maximizeefficiency, making our work load more manageable than it mightotherwise be. We will also discuss possibilities for usingassessment work to re-discover the elements of our teachingpractice that most invigorate us. Paradoxical though it mayseem, we hope to show that by incorporating serious outcomesassessment into our pedagogy, we can turn 'one more thing' intoa more sustainable workload. Rather than taxing us further, thiswork can yield work that is in many ways easier and morerewarding, both for teachers and students.
Assessment of Short Courses	I/D/A	Mary	 Possible solutions to fulfill the requirement of assessing community education classes were discussed. The following were tentatively decided upon: 1) Change the name of Dept – (CE) Short Courses to Dept – (CE) Short Courses and Extended Year. This area will be changed from SSLO to SSLO (hybrid). A generic short course will be added along with a general SLO statement since there are many short courses offered on many different topics and the courses change frequently. To relate the assessment to the course it pertains to, two custom fields will be added to the assessment data summary page: name of course and description of course. 2) Keep Planetarium as a SSLO area.

AS SLO Sub-group	I/D/A	All	 Toño and Mary met with Mayra Cruz, Randy Bryant, and Paul Setziol on December 2nd to discuss the feasibility of forming within the Academic Senate a SLO Sub-group to assist in evaluating the SLO process. The rubric to evaluate SLOACs was suggested as a tool for this endeavor. The AS officers, while seeing this as a well-intentioned effort, had concerns that the application of the rubric and perhaps the sub-group itself could morph into something punitive for faculty. After discussion the core team will withdraw its request for AS sub-group. Instead the rubric will be offered as a tool to faculty
			through SLO Core Team members and the SLO liaisons. Its use will be totally voluntary. In addition, consideration will be given to adding a workshop on the application of this tool at the 2016 Convocation.
