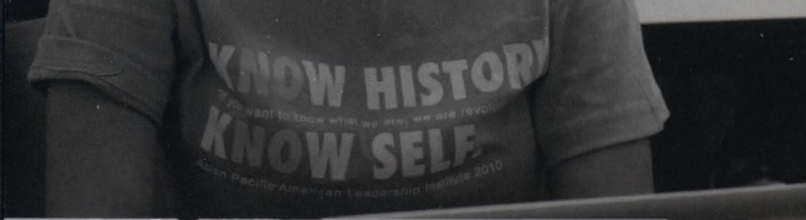

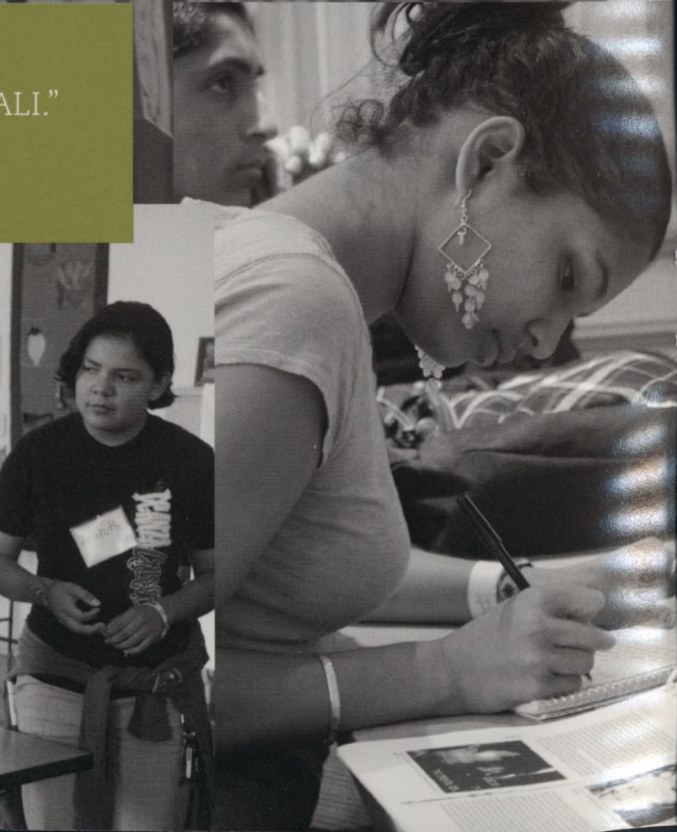

# The Power of Leadership Education

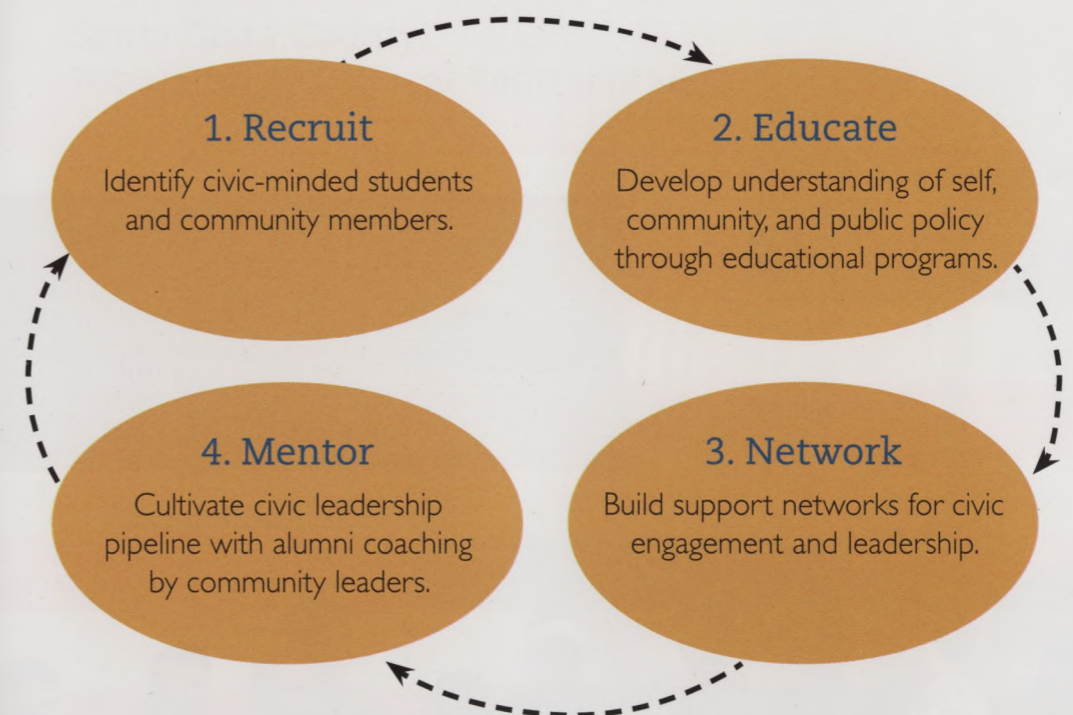
Asian Americans have long been underrepresented in civic leadership positions.

The American system of decentralized public governance requires a large number of civic leadership positions. However, Asian Americans —largely immigrant and minority groups— lack exposure to the pathways for civic participation.

APALI is an organized effort to provide quality civic leadership education and nurture civic leadership. This work advances both the interests of the community and the promise of a multicultural democracy.

**APALI'S MISSION** is to convene civic leaders to provide citizenship education, leadership development, civic engagement, and public service training.

# The Founding of APALI

**APALI's Vision** is parity in Asian Pacific American representation at all levels of public decision-making in Silicon Valley/Bay Area.

As a naturalized citizen from Hong Kong and college professor who became the first Asian American mayor of Cupertino, Dr. Michael Chang's calling was to help qualified Asian Americans become better represented in public offices, government, and the non-profit sector.

At the mayoral inaugural dinner in 1997, a group of community visionaries and philanthropists helped Dr. Chang launch the Asian Pacific American Leadership Institute at De Anza College. The goal was to develop an educational model to build a civic leadership pipeline for Asian Pacific Americans and other underrepresented cultural groups.

De Anza College's APALI has since developed into a premier leadership organization in Silicon Valley / Bay Area with the non-profit tax-exempted Foothill-De Anza Community Colleges Foundation as its fiscal agent.

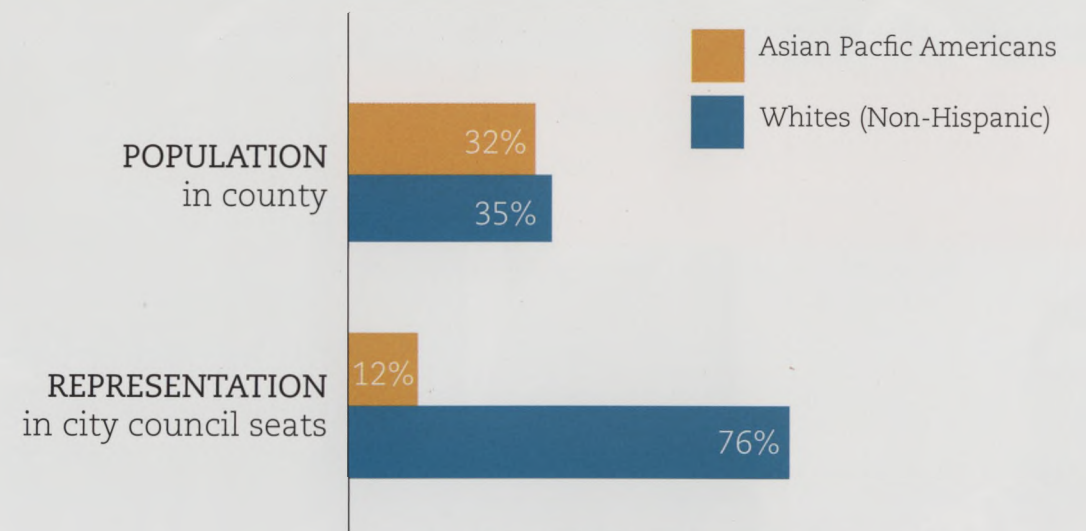
# The Need for Leadership Education

In the last fifteen years, Asian Pacific Americans have become increasingly visible as civic leaders in the greater Silicon Valley region. Many APALI alumni have entered the public sphere as trustees of school districts and city council members, while others have served in local government or non-profit organizations. However, the underrepresentation of Asian Pacific Americans in civic leadership positions persists.

An analysis of elected office holders in Santa Clara County can be revealing. Even in this county where Asian Americans have made great strides in electoral representation, with Mike Honda in Congress and Paul Fong in the State Assembly, Asian Americans are 32% of the population but only 12% and 15% respectively of local city councils and school boards. Of the fifteen cities in Santa Clara County, five have no persons of color serving on city council. Of the five Santa Clara County Supervisorial positions, none are held by Asian Americans.

Unfortunately, Asian American underrepresentation is even more severe in neighboring counties and in other civic leadership arenas such as local government senior executive positions and the boards of major non-profit organizations.

APALI celebrates 15 years of civic education and community impact.

- 2012** Pipeline Mentoring Program is launched at 15th anniversary dinner gala.
- 2011** Since their inceptions, the Summer Youth Leadership Academy has had **461 graduates** and the Civic Leadership Program has had **153 graduates**.
- 2009** Alumni Network is formed with 684 members.
- 2007** Civic Leadership Program introduces innovative curriculum to promote civic leadership in the Asian Pacific American and Latino American communities.
- 2006** Senior Fellows Network is formed to convene over 80 public officials and policy-makers in year-round leadership dialogues.
- 2004** Leadership Training Internship is first offered for mentor interns to lead the Summer Youth Leadership Academy.
- 2000** Bridging the Gap Program is piloted with emerging leaders and De Anza club Asian Pacific American Students for Leadership (APASL) is founded.
- 1999** Summer Youth Leadership Academy graduates its first class of college and high school students.
- 1997** Asian Pacific American Leadership Institute is launched at a De Anza College benefit dinner with 400 guests celebrating Dr. Chang's first inauguration as Mayor of Cupertino.

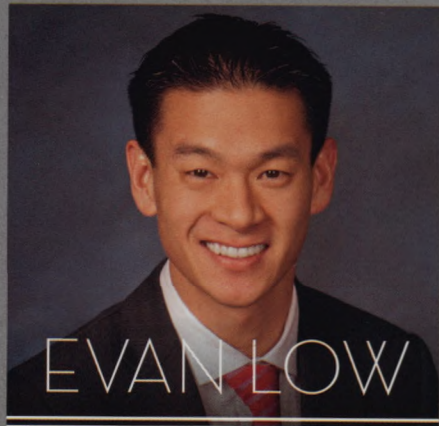

At 21 years old, Evan made his first run for Campbells' City Council. He was unsuccessful. In 2006, he ran again. This time, he made history. He became the first Asian American, openly gay, and youngest person ever elected to the Council. In 2009, Evan became mayor and one of the youngest Asian American mayors in the country.

Evan attributes his early interest in politics in part to his student days at De Anza College. There, through Asian American Studies classes including the APALI Youth Leadership Academy, he was inspired by role models who were Asian American elected officials and community leaders.

Evan remembers, "The APALI program really helped build my sense of identity and gave me a sense of purpose in terms of my commitment to service, who I am, and my role in society."

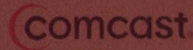
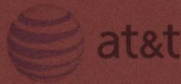
