


Humanities and Liberal Arts Majors: Choose from these options based on your goals and high school GPA



- All eligible students have the option of taking the Math Guided Self-Placement to see if they can begin at a higher level than indicated here.
- Students who have placed in a transfer-level course (STAT C1000, MATH 11, 12, 31, 44, 46 or higher) can register for any course that has a prerequisite of intermediate algebra or other developmental math.
- The two-course precalculus series (MATH 31 and 32) was introduced in 2020. If you took MATH 41, 42 or 43 in the past, please see your counselor.
- All students are eligible for MATH 1A, effective July 1, 2025; other classes may be recommended.
