14. Please provide a thorough description of your program. *

The De Anza Veterans Resource Center (VRC) is dedicated to providing student veterans and their dependents with services that support the attainment of their academic and career goals. Less than 5 years ago, the VRC opened as a dedicated space for veteran students to access a study lounge, food pantry, computers and free printing, and it is also the location of VRC employees. Veterans receive educational benefits after they separate from the military. The VRC has a dedicated two benefits certifying officials to ensure that our veterans are on track to receive their educational benefits as well as financial aid so that they can achieve their educational goals at De Anza College. In addition, the center has a dedicated counselor that helps each individual student to: 1) create an educational plan that aligns with federal and state compliance rules so that our veterans maintain their educational benefits eligibility; 2) become eligible for credit for prior learning; and 3) have access to personal counseling services and student services referrals. The VRC also provides STEM tutoring services. Additional student populations include: dependents of veterans, who are eligible for educational benefits, and military personnel who wish to take courses while on active duty.

Aside from assisting veterans with their educational benefits, the VRC also has a federally funded work study team that employs student veterans. These students, alongside the staff team maintains a monthly newsletter, and plans and hosts events to highlight resources for the population. Events in academic year 2026-27 will include

- 1) The College's Welcome Day's VRC Open House (counselor and certifying officials) & Main Quad Tabling to welcome new veterans, veteran dependents, and active military to De Anza.
- 2) Veterans Day Event & Veterans Resource Fair to honor veterans service to our community, and bring to campus services that community support services in the areas of: health, wellness, community service organizations (Rotary Club, American Legion, etc.), and more.
- 3) Career Fair to bring companies and organizations to campus that focus on hiring veterans and military affiliated students--but this event would be open to the general campus
- 4) Participation in the college's annual transfer day and career day
- 5) Transfer College Campus Visits
- 4) Transfer & Graduation Ceremony

While this is our first annual request for funding, periodically, we have completed additional requests for funding to support our transfer & graduation ceremony.

Annually we serve about 200 student veterans and dependents studying at De Anza with their Veterans Affairs (VA) federal educational benefits; and of that population, the majority identify as Asian American and Pacific Islander, and some of the population are adult learners (nontraditional college aged students). Because a veteran educational benefits are tied to specific federal and state requirements, our students typically persist to the next quarter. We offer dedicated staff and counselors to ensure that students have the opportunity to persist.

There is also a presence of veterans students on campus that do not utilize their educational benefits. This subset of the population may not use their benefits while at De Anza for various reasons such as: they are saving their benefits for their transfer institution; their benefits have been used already or have expired; or they are community members interested in lifelong learning opportunities. However, they are welcome in the VRC, and can partake in events--events which are typically open to all students.

The VRC offers onsite and offsite opportunities for students to engage in cocurricular and extracurricular activities such as Foothill's veterans fun run, college sponsored transfer campus visits and veterans focused events offered through organizations like the American Legion. By encouraging space to participate in such events, students have the opportunity to network and engage in our local community.

The VRC contributes to improving student retention by offering specialized support services (counseling, tutoring, benefits certification, etc.) as well as a dedicated space on campus for our veteran students so to encourage community building, and ensuring student engagement on campus.

The VRC ensures accessibility, equity and inclusion for all students by meeting them where they are; listening to their needs and offering a diverse array of services for the purposes of removing (or reducing) the barriers that impede their academic, financial and career goals.

The VRC is located in Seminar Building (SEM) 3. During recent renovations to SEM 3 prior to the opening of the VRC, the college committed to basic green building features including motion censored lighting so that the lights turn off when not in use; bathroom faucets that automatically shut off; and a regulated climate control.
