



 - A. Enrollment is the big emphasis: Shifted \$200 million from maintenance to support enrollment initiative.
 - B. There are trigger actions (must reach this metric to get \$\$)

	and 'funding games' such as there was \$750 million for student housing and now that sum has been divided over two years. C. 8.13% COLA but not for all programs. For example, Strong Workforce Program does not have this COLA and faculty hires do not get COLA Remember that this budget is far from a done deal at this point.
