Subject: Transfer Center Students, Summer 2022-Fall 2022

### **Overview:**

Students who attend appointments and workshops provided by the Transfer Center are required to register into the SARS scheduling system. In order to obtain the demographics of those who visited the center in the summer and fall 2022 quarters, the center coordinator provided Institutional Research and Planning with the unduplicated student cwids for each quarter.

### Summary:

- There was a total of 1,387 distinct student cwids.
  - 1,257 (91%) visited the center once in summer or fall 2022 quarter.
  - 130 (9%) visited the center twice, at least one time each in the summer and fall term.
- There were 1,063 (77%) distinct students who were enrolled<sup>1</sup> in the term in which they visited the center. The remaining 324 were not enrolled and their breakouts are as follows:
  - 219 were enrolled at De Anza in a term *prior* to their center visit.
  - 84 were enrolled at De Anza in a term *after* their center visit.
  - 5 were enrolled at Foothill (3 prior to and 2 after their center visit).
  - 16 were not enrolled at all.
- Students who enrolled in the same term in which they visited the center are mostly ages 19 or under, followed by 20 to 24. They are likely to be female, Asian and Latinx. One-third self-reported they are from low-income households and a little less than one-quarter are first-generation college students. In 2022-23, so far about 9% international/F1 visa students<sup>2</sup> have visited the center. In addition, some EOPS and DSPS as well as learning community students, mostly enrolled in MPS and Umoja sections, have visited the center as well.

## A. Demographics and Special Programs

Table 1 provides the data for students who visited the Transfer Center and were enrolled in the same term. The headcount is distinct within the term. At the time of this report, the headcounts for special programs' are incomplete as the 2022-23 academic year is still in progress.

- Half of the centers' students are ages 19 or under, followed by 20 to 24.
- Students are likely to be female, Asian and Latinx.
- About one-third of students are low income with household income of \$50,000 or less.
- About 1 out of 5 students are first-generation college students.
- There are some Transfer Center students who are also EOPS and DSPS program students.
