TESTING AND GRADING

All exams will be taken online. They will be open on FRIDAYS 1:35 pm to 3 pm.

There are **9 exams, one extra credit exam and one final exam.** All are online. Follow the instructions carefully. *Each exam has 50 multiple choice questions for a total of 50 points each. Each test may be taken only one time. Each test has a time limit. The time allowed is 25 minutes per exam. Once a test has begun, you must finish it in the allotted time.* The timer will begin as soon as you open the test so be prepared to start. These tests are not open-book. Due to the time constraints, if you attempt to look up answers in the book you will run out of time. You need to be very prepared for these tests. Study hard and memorize all the terms so you only have to recognize the correct answer. This will allow you to move more quickly. The exam will be automatically submitted when the timer runs out. The calendar on canvas will tell you the date and time you can take the test.

NO make-up exams allowed, THEY WILL BE OPEN ON Friday 1:35 PM TO 3 PM. ONCE YOU START THE EXAM, IT WILL STOP IN 25 MINUTES. Start the test latest by 2 pm , so you have enough time to complete the test

Testing dates for each exam –There are 9 EXAMS, 1 Extra credit Exam AND ONE FINAL EXAM. There is no exam for Ch 1.

EXTRA CREDIT(25 minutes) and FINAL EXAM WILL BE CUMULATIVE ON ALL THE CHAPTERS. Extra credit exam will be 50 questions for 25 minutes.

An exam cannot be reopened once the due date passes. If you don't take the test, you get a zero for that test.

Lowest score will be dropped from all exams(9) , including the extra credit exam.(1). To this, score of the Final Exam will be added to get your grade.

Final Grades: The final grade is determined by the percentage of the 500 possible points from the 10 x 50 point exams.
