Course Description:

This is an introductory course exploring the basic elements and principles of observational drawing, employing traditional and experimental media.

Student Learning Outcome Statements (SLO)

- The student will demonstrate freehand drawing skills using a variety of traditional drawing media such as charcoal, graphite, and ink.
- The student will create representational, objective drawings using references such as drawing from observation (still-life) and photographs.
- The student will demonstrate the ability to create drawing compositions based on linear perspective,
- the basic elements and principles of design.

Course Objectives:

A. Demonstrate the use of freehand drawing skills using a variety of techniques.

- B. Demonstrate the use of basic elements and principles of composition.
- C. Apply drawing skills in the interpretation of subject mater using various media.
- D. Demonstrate ability to draw from an objective point of view as well as from the imagination.
- E. Demonstrate an understanding of the creative process.
- F. Compare and contrast works of art representing a diversity of art traditions and cultures.

Method:

The process of drawing develops a heightened awareness of the visual world, an awareness that is both subjective (knowing how you feel about things) and objective (understanding how things actually operate). Art is a way of realizing one's own individuality. The making of art, the making of the self, and the development of one's own personal style are part of the same exciting process. At first, we will work with direct experiences in rendering the objects and environment, while gradually exploring avenues in more imaginative ways (memories, dreams, life experiences, etc.).

Drop Policy:

Lack of communication or non submittal of the projects over a week, may result in your drop from the class.

Grading:

- · Assignments submitted (2 a week) will be 15 points per drawing .
- Late Assignments will be marked down by one letter grade.
- Two subjective drawing projects (this includes the Final Project) with a typed one page- 3 paragraph paper about your drawing process
- 50 POINTS Each (100 Points Total) (The first project will be 45 points with 5 points available for 2 critical comments each.)
- Final Project: This drawing embodies the course objectives noted above and is a performance proficiency exam. Missing the final exam could be an automatic F for the class. Your final grade will depend on your grasp and implementation of the theories and ideas we discuss in the class.

Grading Scale:

A= 90 to 100%, B= 80 to 89%, C= 70 to 79%, D= 60 to 69%, F= Below 60%, and missing the final exam.

Active participation is mandatory and is part of your final grade. Each participant must use critical thinking, constructive comments, and ask questions regarding techniques, content, and visual presentation. It is extremely important you use proper materials for the assignments and projects. No grade for wrong materials.

Art critiques are a dialogue that is shared with others and is important to the artist and art making process. The critics require two thoughtful and critical comments by you, on two other students' projects, which will earn you 5 possible points as part of your project grade.

Project Papers need to be typed and submitted through Canvas. No Points for the paper.
