Course Description:

This introductory course provides an overview of the field of psychology, emphasizing the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. Topics include biological foundations of behavior, perception, learning, memory, cognition, motivation, emotion, developmental psychology, personality, psychological disorders, and social influences.

*4 units: 4 hours lecture

The Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs):

- 1. Describe the ways in which psychology is grounded in the scientific method.
- 2. Demonstrate, by reference to supporting research, findings that underlie everyday knowledge and beliefs as they relate to psychology.
- 3. Create real life examples that show how psychology is present in many human endeavors.
- 4. Contrast the five (5) main models (cognitive, behavioral, psychodynamic, humanistic/positive, socio-cultural) used to explain psychopathology and treatment.



Weekly Classes/Assignments/Projects:

Every week students will be presented with content in the format of PowerPoint lectures, videos, articles to read/discuss, and activities to participate in.

Quizzes:

Every Tuesday, students will take a quiz on the chapter from the week before. These quizzes will be administered during class time, *you must have the sound ON and your camera ON while taking the test*. Anyone needing extended time must arrange that in advance through the Disability Support Services Center. The quiz will be open-note, and through Canvas. There are four (4) optional quizzes throughout the quarter. You may take any of these to replace a lower or missed quiz score. They are only offered the week they are listed and will begin at 8pm on the day noted.

Midterm and Final Reflections:

You will be submitting a typed response for the Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) as listed at the top of this syllabus. You will be asked to respond to SLO's numbers 1 (5 pt) and 2 (20 pt) for your Mid-term (total of 25 pt).

Your **FINAL** will be comprised of two parts:

- 1. You will be answering SLO #4 (10pt) (SLO #3 will be addressed in your discussions and activities each week).
- 2. Additionally, you will be writing a reflection paper. This will be a chance for you to connect a few parts of the content to yourself and give it meaning. The directions for that are posted on Canvas in greater detail.

Both your Mid-term and Final SLO's will be answered during class time, and submitted to canvas. There is no format requirement (meaning MLA or APA).
